

Aquatic Plants of Alberta

Description: this course explores the roles of aquatic and riparian vegetation in supporting aquatic wildlife; plants for erosion control and improving water quality; and identification of over 100 species and genera of submerged, floating, and deeper-growing emergent aquatic plants. Aquatic invasive plants are included. There is also an optional laws and regulations module pertaining to the rules and approvals associated with aquatic and shoreline vegetation. This is the only course of this kind available in Canada.

Target audience: students, consultants, fisheries biologists, wetland scientists, academics, water stewardship groups, shoreline

Volume: roughly 20 hours of content.
